In the name of God Amen I Christopher Hovey being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and sound memory do Make and Ordain this My last will and testament and in the following manner and form to wit first I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth from whence it came, Secondly I order that

and bequeath unto my
well beloved wife Catherine Hanner twelve
Bushels of good wheat sent to the mill
and brought back to her yearly with
One hundred weight of pot for year
with sixty pounds of sugar and five
pounds of butter for year with her bed
and furniture to the bed during her life
and at her decease to dispose of the
bed and furniture as we shall think
best, Item I do give and bequeath unto
my beloved Children Christopher Catherine Anne
Mary Philip, John, Michael and my son
Christopher being all my estate real and personal
to be equally divided except my son Philip
which is to have ten pounds more and my
sons John & Michael six pounds Each more
then the rest and seven pounds to be
deducted out of my Christopher being to come
to the rest of my being and I do allow my

bed and furniture as we shall think
best, Item I do give and bequeath unto
my beloved Children Christiana Catharine Anne
Mary Philip, John, Michael and my son
Christopher being all my estate ~~real~~ and personal
to be equally divided except my son Philip
which is to have ten pounds more and my
sons John & Michael six pounds each more
then the rest and seven pounds to be
deducted out of my Christopher being to come
to the rest of my being and I do allow my
son John to stay on the place and make
what profits he can if he sees fit during the
time my wife shall live with giving her
the maintenance above mentioned with
finding her one good milk cow during
her life to be supported as the rest of the stock
and supposing my son John should die or
refuse taking the place then the place

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maintainment
be equally divided among my heirs as
mentioned and at my decease all my moveable
property to be sold at publick sale and all
as above mentioned and likewise at my wife
decease my lands to be sold and divided
as above mentioned by my under named exors
I do constitute and Ordain my two well be-
long Adam Howard and John Howard
be the sole Executors of this my last will and
Testament &c. &c. I do allow my wife Catharine
more then has been above mentioned that
clothing sufficient for a woman of her age
if in Case she should be sick or stand in
need she is to be furnished with sufficient
