mind and memory do make this my Last
will and Testament in manner as follows
to wit. I Command my Body to the Earth
from which it was taken and to be Buried
in a decent manner and as to my worldly
Goods I Give and bequeath unto God to

and from first I Give and bequeath to my
wife Christina my whole Estate to her use
and to Dispose of as she shall see Cause
and the bond I have on my son Daniel
for One hundred and fifty pounds I Give
and bequeath it to him at my death But
is to pay seven pounds ten shillings to his
Every year as long as she liveth I Give and
bequeath unto my son Daniel Halfrey
plantation whereon he now lives for ever
I Give and bequeath unto my two daughters
Elizabeth and Charlotte ~~one~~ Equal share
between them of the plantation lying on
Kinsely Ridge after my wife's decease
and unto my two daughters Dolly and Mary
I Give and bequeath One shillings now
Leave my wife and son Daniel Halfrey
to be Executors of this my last will and
testament and do hereby renounce all other
wills and testaments Confirming this to be
my last will and testament as witness
I do hereby set my hand and seal

I give and bequeath unto my two daughters
Elizabeth and Charlotte an equal share
between them of the plantation lying on
Kinsely Ridge after my wife's decease
and unto my two daughters Dolly and Catharine
