in this life I do leave and bequeath in the manner  
as followeth first of all I leave and bequeath on  
to my Deacon and leaving Wyle the full power of  
my plantation where I do now live to her  
disposal till her death also I leave her the best  
house & lands on the plantation her children

Two horses at own disposal after the test  
of my mortall estate I leave it by the sole of  
publick Handed and after all Just debts and  
expenses is paid it is to be disposed of  
in manner following in the most placent have  
and bequeath onto my son Alexander Campbell  
the plantation where I now live after his  
age of Twenty one to him and the daughter  
heirs of his body for ever but if this mother  
should leave till he of age she is to have  
full power as apert on the plantation also  
I leave to my son which one bay horse and  
buck and saddle and for what money I have  
left to beloved wife and daughter Letty  
I also leave and bequeath onto my daughter  
Lily

bequeath to my Daughter Catharine Campbell  
my negroes & stock mare on brook and  
I also leave to her and her husband one hundred  
and five dollars and five pence and I also leave  
to her and her husband one hundred and five  
pence and I also leave to her and her husband  
one hundred and five dollars and five pence  
of information and advice that the said estate  
after estate bound to be sold and divided  
equally among my wife & John Wilson  
part and it is also my will and desire that  
my Dear and loving wife & John Wilson  
should be my sole and sole Exec. of this  
my last Will and Testament and I do hereby  
by Revocation and disannul all other wills and  
Testaments or legacies ever made or done by  
myself and my wife except this and my will
