unto mind the mortality of my Body & knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my Last Will and
Testament that is to say Principally & first of all Give & Recommend
my soul into the hands of God who gave it my Body I Recommend
to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like decent manner at the dis-
cretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection
I shall receive the same Again by the mighty power of God & touching
such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this
life I give devise by Act and of the Tenure in the manner following man-
ner to wit I give devise & Recommend it unto my Well beloved Son David of all
my Just debts and Lawfull charges to be paid & satisfied as far as
my Estate may extend leaving time for my Executors to dispose
of the same at their discretion to the best Advantage

And it is my will and devise that my Land on Stony Branch it being the
Land I purchased of Joseph Smith and Whence Adam Walker now
dwells be sold by my Executors herein after named and that my Exe-

trade and that he then be at liberty to choose the trade he wishes to learn.

It is my Will and desire that George Black have my son Henry until
he is of sufficient age to be bound out to a trade and that then he be at

liberty to choose what trade he wishes to learn.

It is my Will and desire notwithstanding the above directions Respecting

my two sons John & Henry that my loving Wife Mary of the Church to keep
them if she should be able to support them to keep them until they arrive

to sufficient age to be bound out to trades.

Item, It is my Will and desire that if any thing should be left of the state of my
lands after paying my Just Debts that my loving Wife Mary shall keep
the same in her hands for the purpose of raising my Children.

It is my Will and desire that my Executors do pay George Black the sum
of eight pounds for the trouble and expenses he has been at on my Account dur-
ing my sickness at his House.

I do by these presents constitute and appoint my loving Wife
Mary Harbord Executrix to & am Ratified my Executors of this my Last
Will & Testament utterly revoking and annulling all other Wills heretofore
made by me. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the day and year first above written.
