to sell any part or parcel of my land I now hold in Duquesne County in the Colony of Pennsylvania
and make payment to my creditors by bid if in case they will be paid without selling
any of my lands, then my wife Anna Andriah shall still have the third part of my land.

After my son Frederick Andriah comes to age during his natural life, and after his death I
intend to give out all my lands above mentioned among them so as to Frederick Andriah
George Andriah and to Jacob Andriah, each one to have an equal share with the other, to them
and their heirs executors administrators and assigns forever.

Also I do make and Ordain my beloved friends John Heller and Jacob Rinker Esq^r sole Executors of
this my last Will and Testament, to take care and see the same performed according to my true intent
and desire in making this my last will and Testament.
