County of Shanandoah and State of Virginia being very sick and weak
in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God for it
thereby calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that
it is appointed for all men once to die to do make and certify that

My body and knowing ^{that} it is appointed for all men once to die do make
and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally
and for full ~~give~~ and recommend my soul into the hands of god that
gavest and for my body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a
Christian like and Decent manner at the Direction of my Friends
not Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive them
again by the mighty power of god and as touching such worldly
Estate where with it hath pleased god to bless me in this life I
give devise and Dispose the same in the following manner and for
me first I give and bequeath to Catharina my Dearlly beloved wife
the Land Room and stove and half of the Cotten in my dwell-
ing house I now live in and my bed and bed Cloaths and
my Cutt knives and forches and my two small iron pots and
my Chest and table spinning wheel and two hoes my
prayer and some Book and box Iron and my pot rack
and my iron Ladels flesh fork and skimmer and one Cow and a heifer
to have her Cows and my sone mare and cow sheep and the thirds of all
grain hay or orchard or any kind of fruit that shall be raised

grain hay or orchard or any kind of furniture that shall be raised
in any of the clear time that I have now the grain hay or any kind
of furniture shall be Devised on the field the grain and hay stack and
corn pulled and shall be delivered to my barn and bran and stable
room found her and the thirds of my garden and a little lot Laying on
a hill ^{the} ~~fouring~~ ^{will} ~~pass~~ ^{the} house and the thirds of the Land
~~with~~ her natural death and the goods for ever and she is allowed
to have her part mentioned of the house as long as she lives and
and keeps single whom I otherwise constitute make and ordain
John Blye my only and Sole Ex^r of this my last will and
testaments likewise I give to my well beloved son Jacob Lockmiller
all my lands messuages and tenements by him fully to be enjoyed
and enjoyed with paying one hundred pounds current money
of Virginia to be paid to my seven children four sons and three
daughters each of them to receive an equal part to be
paid in the following manner and for me as hereafter will
make be my son Jacob Lockmiller has now received one
fourth part of the above the first payment to be

my son John the half of his part to be paid at the end of two years after
my Death and the other half in one year after further the next pay-
ment to be paid to my Daughter Barbara the half in four years
after my Death and the other in a year after that and soon here-
after the half of one payment still the next eldest till they are
all paid.
