 ing, I recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it, and
 my body, I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian Burial at
 the pleasure of my Executors, and as touching what worldly Estate wherewith
 it hath pleased God to bless me in this world, I give devise and bequeath
 the same in following manner and form, first I give and ordain my dearly
 beloved wife Barbara for my Executor that shall have all the household
 goods and every thing in her house, so long as she is a widow and shall pay all
 debts and fil, also I give to my well beloved sons Jacob and John
 and Peter each of them in the inheritance and ten acres the whole of the land
 divided in four equal but my youngest son Oden shall have to have the same I leave
 to the said Barbara for her life, and after her death the same shall be divided
 out of the land with an acre and a half for each of my three sons Jacob, John
 and Oden and the shall have my one fourth and only fourth part of the land
 and in the several parcels, but the first payment shall be first paid as my debt
 and as a full payment the first payment, and I do hereby declare and revoke all
 former Testaments, wills, bequests Executors and Ratifying and Confirming this
 and no other to be my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have here
