Constitute and appoint this my last will and Testament.

Impressed I to my wife and desire that all my Debt (both together with my personal Estate,
be discharged as soon as conveniently after my Decease.

Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Elizabeth during her natural life Penonble
Provision and God house room as my said wife shall chose upon my said Plantation and one
God cow, & two Sheep, and four and a half and a stable and a number of pasture of plants her
own choosing after seeding of what part of ground she will chose yearly during her life and
one third part of the hemp yearly growing upon my Plantation and three barrels of good money
yearly during her life & twenty Bushels of good wheat, and four Bushels of Oats yearly during
her life, and one third part of the Plantation, and one third part of all the fruit growing on
said Plantation during her life, and the of house furniture shall all be in four parts equally
divided between her and weight of both yearly during her life.

Item I give and bequeath to my eldest son Jacob Robins him and his heirs one Shilling Sterling of the
same shall be demanded and no more.

Item I give and bequeath to my eldest Daughter Anna, ^{her} and her heirs one Shilling Sterling of the
same shall be demanded and no more.

Item I give and bequeath to my youngest Daughter Elizabeth both one cow two Sheep three horses fifty Pounds
at her death or my, and the same to be paid immediately following her Decease yearly at the first day
of May in the year of four score one thousand seven hundred and
seventy five.

Item I give and bequeath to

same shall be burned and destroyed.

Item I give and bequeath to my younger daughter Elisabeth one cow two sheep two horses and fifty
of household money, and the same to be paid to her in the following Ten County years after the first day
of January next after the first day of May in the year four thousand three hundred and
seventy five.

I bless you and beg for the many fine youngest sons Daniel and Henry my children and wishing to
 them a new house a spouse forever so that the hereafter may have full power to grant a good
 will and is my will and desire that my son Daniel shall have four pounds sterling money
 more than any other thing and my will and desire that all my present estate consisting of
 and tithes. Also and all the rest of my moveable estate to be equally divided among my
 two sons and if it should happen that either of my sons should die before they become of age then
 my will and desire that the same shall be equally divided among the remaining part of my
 children which shall then live

And I hereby nominate and appoint my True Friends Alexander Kile, Adam Bickel
to be Executors of this my last will and Testament freely making and signifying my will
as well by me at any Time heretofore made Intestments whereof I have hereto set my hand,
and seal this Twenty ninth day of April One thousand seven hundred and twenty one.

A Court held for Durham County on Tuesday April the 27th 1770

The Last will and Testament of James Peter was proved by the oaths of James Peter and Mathias Hite witnesses thereto, sworn to by Alexander Hite and Adam Blandish the Executors, James Peter was ordered to be Recorded, and on motion of the said Executors Caliphale is granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in due form, giving security, whereupon they together with James Peter and the said security entered into and acknowledged their bond for their due and faithful administration of the said deceased's Estate and performance of his will aforesaid.

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I promise men by these presents that we Alexander Hite Adam Blandish and James Peter are held and firmly bound unto Reverend Harrison, Francis Shafter, Joseph Cogh, Henry Nelson, Abraham, Keller and John Dutton Gentlemen Justices of the County Court of Durham now sitting in the sum of Three hundred pounds current money of Virginia to the which payment will and truly to be made to the said Justices and their successors we bind our selves and every of us our heirs Executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals this 27th day of April 1770.

The Condition of this Obligation is such that if the above bound Alexander Hite & Adam Blandish Executors of the Last will and Testament of James Peter do cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said James Peter and do pay to the said Justices the sum of Three hundred pounds current money of Virginia within the time and to the place therein expressed.
