During of her natural life, these Thousand Dollars to be
100 Dollars to be collected from the following manner and all
them I give & bequeath to my only beloved son John Smith a certain
parcel of Land that he now possessed of beginning at
your line or Boundary at the upper end of a field of mine
along the ^{2nd} highest straight to the river, then down
the river to the lower end of the same then
along the dividing fence between him & Joseph Brown
to the 1st fence, then to the lower end of the same then
straight across over to a certain corner or what point
in the corner of the field there a straight line to the
river by the upper end of his field on condition of pay-
ing of five Hundred \$ 500.00 to my wife Suseth annually
during her natural life.

Then I Give, and bequeath unto my beloved son W^m
Smith a certain parcel of Land that he now poss-
essed of beginning at the river, running up the river
then along the fence to a certain point then
down the river to the lower end of the same then

line thence down the said line to Will Owens path upon a

the said line several courses to the beginning of the Condition
that she or her Heirs do pay five hundred pounds of tobacco unto my
wife Judith annually during the time of her natural life.
Here I give & bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Mary Dyer
all the acreage of my Land included in that bequest
made by William Rupel on condition that she or her Heirs
do pay five hundred pounds of tobacco unto my wife Judith
annually during the time of her natural life.
