Virginia being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thus shewing
that it is appointed for all men once to Die I comend and Ordain this my Last will
and Testament, and first I give and recommend my soul to god who gave it and
my body to be buried in a Christian like manner at the Discretion of my Executors
nothing Doubting but at the generall resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty Power of god and as for such worldly goods as god has blessed
me with in this life I Give and bequeath them in manner following the first
Item my Will and Desire that all my Just debts and funeral Charges be paid and
Satisfied Then I Give to my beloved wife Catharine Miller one of my best beds
an Furniture and one of my best breeding Horses and two of my best bred Cattle
and one third part of all my Moveable Estate Then I Give and bequeath to my
Beloved son William Miller part of the plantation I now live in joining thence
I now beginning at a White Oak on the River banks bearing to the south and
miserable of a corner to the river and to the north the White Oak
which is marked as a house thence I run off from the river back the corner
to the plantation of my wife Catharine Miller then of course thence south
into the plantation of the River running to the River back to bearing 200 acres
more Then I Give and bequeath to my beloved son Isaac Miller all that
plantation or tract of land on the north bearing to the river and to the south

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Waterford. Here I give to my beloved wife Catharine Miller one of my best
and furniture was one of my best breeding horses and one of my best horse-holds
and one third part of all my Moveable Estate. Here I give and bequeath to my
beloved son William Miller part of the plantation I now live in joining
Hond beginning at a White Oak on the River banks comes to Island and
under. Here I give and bequeath to my Beloved son about the 10th of March
1740 a small piece of land near the River from the river back the small
plantation to the River and a small plantation by the River. Here I give and
bequeath to my Beloved son the River bank containing 200 acres or
more. Here I give and bequeath to my beloved son Isaac Miller all that
plantation or tract of land on the north bank of the River by a line
to me by his Lordship joining the River here all containing 133 Acres
with all the Rights belonging to the same. Here I give and bequeath to my
beloved Daughter Rebecca Miller all that tract of land I bought of John
O'Connell and his wife Mary O'Connell on the last of March joining the River
containing 200 Acres and also one quarter and furniture and I leave to
Here I give and bequeath to my Beloved Daughter Elizabeth Miller the
Remainder of land joining the above bequeathed land to my son William
beginning at a White Oak on the River bank a small plantation
William and my Beloved Daughter Elizabeth Miller on the River about the 10th of March

To a large Whomore. The Corn is the Land I bequeath to my son in Law Thomas
Allen Thome with all the same the several houses but to a Cornfield
for my wife by and Peter where the same with the 10000 L. in the name of Berner
near the great road from the said Cornfield to the said Cornfield
for my son William Thome with his share the several houses to the beginning
of the road on the south river bank (Barnstaple) 175 Acres more or less and also
I give to leave and befalls and one good Bed and furniture. Item the above
I give to leave to them and to each of their heirs and Assigns forever
Item I give to my beloved stepson Joseph Hopewell Ten pounds Virginia
money and discharge him of what he is or now beareth in my book. Item
I give to my beloved step Daughter Sarah Millar wife of James Millar
Twenty Pounds for her own use at her Desire within one year after my decease
and her heirs and James shall have no Right to any Part thereof unless
by his wife's express order or Desire and if she should die before this will
can be executed my Executors may Dispose of the same for the Benefit of
her Children at their Discretion. Item I give to my son Thomas Allen Thome
all that he shall be in my Debt at my Death if it not exceeds fifty pounds
but if more he shall pay to my Executors. The rest of my Moveable Estate
to be equally divided between my son Isaac Millar and my three Daughters
to wit Elizabeth the wife of Thomas Allen and Rebecca and Elizabeth Millar

I rest all that the wife of Thomas Allen and Rebecca and Elizabeth Millar and Park of my children is to have their own stock as a household and
and Lacey. Now I have bequeathed my beloved and dear daughter
my beloved son in San Thomas Allen Executors of this my last will and
Testament disposing of all and every other former wills and Testaments
and bequests by me made Ratifying and confirming this to be my last
will and bequest by me made and I have signed off and sealed my
last will and seal this day of October and in the year of our Lord one thousand
one hundred and twenty and seventy six
