Item I Give & bequeath unto my son Drew Long my lands lying on the
lower branch bought of James Stanley containing one hundred
acres & my negro man ^{called} Tom to him & his heirs forever

Item I Give & bequeath to my son David Long my negro boy called
Ned & the sum of one hundred pounds current money of Virginia
to him & his heirs forever

Item I Give & bequeath to my son Arthur Long my negro boy called
Sam & the sum of one hundred pounds current money of Virginia

to him & his heirs for ever

Item I Give an bequeath to my son Littleton Long the tract of my land bought of John Wright the one containing one hundred the other two hundred twenty five & my negro boy called Ben to him

His heirs for ever

Item I Give & bequeath unto my three sons John Long Drury Long & Littleton Long my mill on Flat Swamp to them & their heirs for ever

Item I Give ^{bequeath} unto my daughter Mary Dawson my negro woman called Cella to her & her heirs for ever

Item I Give & bequeath unto my daughter Lucy Long my negro girl called Hannah to her & her heirs for ever
