Item I Give devise & bequeath to my dear & Loving wife. Nine Shillings & Profits of my Lands & Plantations whereon I now Live together with the use Profit & Labour of my ^{natural} negro Slaves named Simon & for & during her life or Widowhood also the use & benefit of all my household furniture & stock during the said term also whether she shall be head of furniture to her & her heirs forever

Item I Give devise & bequeath unto my son William all my Lands & Plantations whereon I now Live also Part of my Lands in the Piney woods Containing one hundred & thirty Acres more or less as its Particulars bound also my negro man slave named Simon & one negro Girl named Venus one feather bed & furniture one Gun & one sword one pair of Spigars mules all my working Tools & forty Gallon Still & its Utensils on the following

my son in Law W^m Edwards the liberty of distilling his own
Liquors in the said Mill also one cow & half and my stock of
Cattle horses hogs & traps after his Mothers death in
Widowhood to him & his heirs forever

And I give devise & bequeath unto my son Elias the sum of one pound
free Willing's current money all the rest of my estate after
my just Debts are Paid & my wife's deceased Marriage I give to
be equally divided between my four Children William Drifell
Mary & Anne and I desire that my friends Job Wright
James Soder John Bryant & Birdman Joyner do make
the division amongst them And Lastly I Nominate
constitute & appoint my Loving wife Anne & my son
William to be Executors of this my Last Will & Testament as
Witness my hand & seal this 17 day of January 1761
