I Benjamin Garret of Southampton county Virginia being at
this time weak of body but in perfect sound memory do make
ordain this my last will & testament in manner following (To wit)

First I Leave the use of all my estate after my debts paid to my wife Mary
Garret during ~~her~~ life or widowhood But in case my wife should
live a single life Years not wasting the estate thereof then in
my will I declare that my personal estate may be equally divid
between my wife Mary Garret my daughter Elizabeth Garret
Ann Garret & my son William Garret or the surviving one of my
children at the expiration of the term of twelve Years after my
decease thereof I give them of their her for ever

Secondly I Give my son W^m Garret after the death or widowhood of my
wife or twelve Years as above mentioned all my land lying
in Southampton county both lands of the other part given him
as above I Give to him of this her for ever

Lastly I do appoint my loving wife Mary Garret of Albington Jones
my whole & sole executrix on this my last will & testament & I charge
in manner above directed Give under my hand & seal this
14th day of March 1792

First I leave the use of all my estate after my death to my wife Mary
Parrel during her life or widowhood But in case my wife should
live a single life I leave not wasting the estate thereof then die
my will & desire that my personal estate may be equally divided
between my wife Mary Parrel my daughter Elizabeth Parrel
Ann Parrel & my son William Parrel or the surviving ones of my
children and the expiration of the term of twelve years aforesaid
every part thereof I give them & their heirs for ever

Secondly I give my son W^m Parrel after the death or widowhood of my
wife or twelve years as above mentioned all my land lying
in Southampton county both lands of the other part given him
as above I give to him & his heirs for ever

Lastly I do appoint my loving wife Mary Parrel & Abington Jones
my whole & sole Executors in this my last will & testament to perform
in manner above directed Given under my hand & seal this
Twenty fifth day of July A.D. 1701. Given hand & seal by me

At a Court held for the county of Southampton the 11 day of May 1789
This will was presented in court by Albington Jones one of the executors
therein named proved by the oath of Benjamin Barham & Henry
Thomas & by the solemn affirmations of Breckins Peete (he being
one of the People called Quakers) the witnesses thereto & orders to be
made for the motion of the said executors made oath according
to said Certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof
in due form giving security whereupon
