 and thence from the head thereof a straight Course to the said Porter line, to him
 and his Heirs forever.

Item I give & Bequeath unto my son Henry Turner the Remainder of said land
 Tract Bought of said Edmunds, to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give & Bequeath unto my son Nathan Turner my Tract of Land Which
 he now lives, it being on the South side of Cooper Swamp, to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my son Benjamin Turner my Negro, Old Abram
 now about two thousand worth of Gold also my Whole Crop now growing
 on the land given him, also my Stock of Hogs & one Feather bed and Furniture
 also all my Horses and Axes and also my two Boats to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my son Henry Turner my Negro Young Abram
 also one Feather bed and Furniture, also one Vest to him and his heirs forever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Turner my Negro Girl Sarah
 also my Ready Money also one Bed and Furniture, also one Gun and calf
 to her and her heirs forever.

also my ready money, also two Red and white mules, also one grey and one
