By me, Peter Storer, citizen of the County of South Hampton being
sick & weak of body but of perfect mind & memory fit to administer his goods
& effects. I do hereby declare & certify that my last will and
testament made in the uncertainty of my being here do now & then my last will and
testament & I now disown it & wishing all other wills to be null &
void by me.

I do hereby give and bequeath my soul to God that gave it me & my body to be interred
in the said church to have full conception of all my acts & my duty to these with to be
buried at the desecration of my body hereafter named.

Attest. I send to my beloved wife Maria Sunday during her natural life to have the
time when I pass living the lands purchased of the Earl of Dorset
and my fishing place here after following done by the said Tom Daffey
my attorney for my self. And witness for me by Jack Newell my blackfellow

All my work houses, as also my chimney house and called Sally & her children all my negroes
and eighty head of hogs if so many to be found before I die to my plantation interest
and my household kitchen furniture this legacy is intended in view of her
decease and to enable her to educate & maintain my children until they arrive
to the age of twenty four years or are married whichever comes first happen
and after the decease of my wife I desire that she be equally divided
between all the children I shall leave by her Viz Christiana Elizabeth Adam
Byrd Joshua Claude & James & their heirs.

Item - I give to my said wife all my fallowing hogs & add to all my grain cotton
flax & my spinning & weaving utensils & one hundred pounds each
Item - I give to my son Edwin Lundy all my lands given to me by my father except
the fishing place also the lands I purchased of Robert Walker to my said
son and to his heirs forever but should he die under the age of twenty one years
and without issue living at his death I then give the said lands to my said
son James Lundy & to his heirs forever.

Item - I give to my son Byrd Lundy after the decease of my beloved wife Christiana
the lands plantation which I have given her because of also the fishing place
to him & to his heirs forever but should he die under the age of twenty one years
and without issue living at his death I then give the said lands to my

and without issue, living at his death then I give the said plantation Slaves
to my son Joshua Claude Lundy & to his heirs forever

I give Bequeath to my son Joshua Claude Lundy & to his heirs forever
a negro girl named Dolly & her increase

Item

I give Bequeath to my son James Lundy & to his heirs a negro girl named

Nelly & her full increase

Item

I give Bequeath to my daughter Christiana and to her heirs a negro girl named
Dessey & to her full increase and a flat wheel

Item

I give Bequeath to my daughter Molly & to her heirs a negro boy named Ben
a young duplex mare a black foal & a colt both with iron rings at the ears
One hundred & fifty pounds of cash & a flat wheel

Item

I give Bequeath to my daughter Betty & to her heirs a negro girl named
Lucy & her increase and a flat wheel

Item

I give the slaves & land my wife be divided as before directed by three persons to be
nominated by the worshippell court of South Hampton County & that at the decease
of my said wife the personal estate left her may by my testator the survivors of them
be sold & the money coming from such sale equally divided amongst all
the children & next of kin living then

Item

The residue of my estate either real or personal I desire may at a convenient
time be sold by my executors at public credit otherwise

Noting their future increase

Item

I give & bequeath to my daughter Christian and to her heirs a negro girl named Dorothy Brown, at her marriage to be sold or given away on a slave street.

Item

I give & bequeath to my daughter Molly its heirs & negro boy named George a young daughter Jane a black woman with a chest with iron rings at the end & one hundred & fifty pounds of cash & a flat wheel

Item

I give & bequeath to my daughter Betty & to her heirs a negro girl named Lucy & her increase and a flat wheel

Item

I desire the slaves held by my wife be divided as before directed by three persons to be nominated by the worshippfull court of Southampton county & that at the death of my said wife the personal estate left her may by my executors the survivors of them be sold and the money arising from such sale equally divided amongst all my children except myself and my daughter Molly

Item

The residue of my estate whether real or personal I desire may at a convenient time be sold by my executors at full credit as they may judge most expedient the money arising from such sale together with the money received on land or other interest at cash I may have by me be divided amongst all my children without representation except my daughter Molly and she first
protesteth and affirmit my beloved wife Lucy deceased by her own clear steps & sayes record - that there is no man in the world

Testament of Mr. Melville whereof these words set my hand & seal this 9th
day of December 1777

I desire my children & co. may be equally divided among themselves &
my children I do wish to my executors at their comittance or we are now willed

to go & sealed published
