In the name of god amen Charles Galtthap of
the parish of cottonway and county of Southampton being
very sick and weak but of sound mind do make this my last
will and testament in manner following

I give unto my son Edward Galtthap and his heirs
forever the land and plantation whereon I now live being about four
hundred and seventy five acres I also give my said the
land I bought of Wm Deane & Leonard Drey being about
four hundred & twenty five acres to him and his heirs
forever

I also I give unto my son Anthony Galtthap and his heirs
forever my land and plantation bought of the cottonway
Indians containing four hundred acres of land

Item I give unto my son James Burke Gallagher and his heirs
former my land and plantation on Cosumega which I bought
of Benjamin Clefton being about three hundred & sixty five
acres.

Item I give unto my daughter Mary Bartley all that part of my
estate I have given her in possession already.

Item I give unto my daughter Francis Jones my negro woman Sarah
her son Ben and my negro Harryson.

Item As for as much as my wife is now with child and should
she be delivered of a son I then give unto my said son my
land and plantation in York county and Charles parish contain-
ing about two hundred and thirty six acres to have and his
heirs forever. And in case the child my wife is now big-
g with should be a daughter I then give unto her the afore-
said plantation in York county to my son Edward Gallagher & his heirs forever.

Item I give all the remainder of my estate of what nature soever to be

equally divided amongst my seven children ^{Martha Anne, Edward, Anthony and James my wife is now big with} And for
much as my wife will take such part of my estate as the
law shall give her my will and desire is that the slaves who
shall be in my house ^{after his death} should be equally divided amongst
my seven children ^{alive or dead} and that or children my
wife is now big with

I do appoint my sons in law John Bayley and Jesse Jones
my executors of this my last will and Testament hereby
revoking all other wills heretofore made by me I Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighth
day of November 1856

 Bayley and John Jones the witnesses thereto sworn to be true and of John
 the executor thereof Sarah the widow of the testator also refused to take
 an oath to the said will and estate. Whereupon on the motion of
 Edmund Tyler who made oath according to law certificate was
 granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of
 the said decedent with this will annexed giving security thereon.
