dispose thereof as followeth

Item I give and bequeath to my Son William Mackey all my
Land and plantation whereon I now live which I purchased
of Joseph Harris and William Harris not disturbing
his Mother in her Last Possession of the same during her
natural life but after her decease to turn and be His forever

Item I give to my Daughter Ann Mackey my Negro woman
named Hannah after my Wifes decease the same to her and
her Heirs forever

Item but if my aforesaid Negro Woman Hannah shall bring to
good one Child or Children thereby give one of her Children
if she have any to my Daughter Sally Mackey to be

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if she have any to my Daughter Sally Mackey to be
delivered to her when the said Negro Child shall attain
to three years of Age the same to her and her Heirs forever

Item I give to my Daughter Sally Mackey Sixteen Pounds
current money to be paid to her at sixteen years of age or
her marriage with what Interest my Executors can get for ye
same till the aforesaid time which said sixteen pounds I
allott into my Executors Hands to be put to Interest for the
Use of my Child and not to come unto my Estate which
said money is to be paid for my Land which I sold to Jos
Bradshaw the to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I do hereby empower my Executors Robert Carr and Chas
Powers to acknowledge my Land to Joseph Bradshaw
in my name and to put him in full possession of the same
Item but in case either of my aforesaid Daughters Die
without any Lawful Heir in that Case I give her

part to the other of them two that is living and in case both
of my afo^d Daughters should Die without any Lawful Heir in
that case I give all their parts of the afo^d Negroes which I
have given them to my Son William Mackey after his
Mothers decease the same to him and his Heirs forever

Item my Will and desire is that my Negro Woman named
Mannahall her Increase be and remain in y^e Possession of
my Loving Wife Hope Mackey for her life during her natural
Life

Item I give to my Son John Mackey fifteen shillings current
Money after his Mothers decease and no more.

Item I give to my Daughter Hope Joyner fifteen shillings current
money after her Mothers decease and no more.

Item I give to my Daughter Dianah Bradshaw fifteen shillings
current money after her Mothers decease and no more.

Item I give to my Grand Daughter Frances Armistead five

shillings current money after my Wife's decease and no more

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From ^{to} my loving wife Abigail Mackey all the rest & remainder
of my Estate be it of what kind or Quality soever During her
natural life and after her decease to be Equally divided among
my three Children to say my Son William and my daughter
Ann Mackey and my Daughter Sally Mackey the same
to them and their Heirs forever.

Lastly I make constitute Ordain and appoint my well beloved friend
Charles Pivers & Robert Carr my whole sole Executors of this
my last Will & Testament Revoking & annulling all
other Will or Wills by me heretofore made or Declared. In
