In the name of God amen I Edward Lundy of St Lukes
Southampton County, Virginia Wills 1772-1782

Parish and County of Southampton being of sound and disposing
Mind and Memory do make this my last Will and Testament as
follows

Imprimis

I find to my son James Lundy during his natural life the
use of a Tract or parcel of land lying on Meherrin River Beginning
at an oak on the Bank of the River below the mouth of Tellers Gut
(so called) and thence by a line of marked Trees to a Red Oak on the
South side the deep Creek it being my Old plantation and the
said land after his decease I give the said Land to my son
Drenny and to the heirs of his Body lawfully begotten for ever
I Also find to my son James Lundy during his natural life
my Negroes Brandon Dick Nell and her child Lettice and after
his decease to return to my estate and be considered as part
thereof and to be divided as is hereafter directed to be done
among all my Children

I Give and bequeath to my son John Lundy my Negroes Phillis
Mingo Daniel & Cuba together with one oval Table to him and
his heirs for ever

Item

I Give and bequeath to my son Edward Lundy my Negroes
Lewis & Polly Hannah and Lydia together with five head of
Cattle to him and his heirs for ever

Item

I Give and bequeath to my son Byrd Lundy my Negroes Paymon

Henry Lundy my son
cattle to him and his heirs for ever

Item I Give and bequeath to my son Byrd Lundy my Negroes Tay
to him and his heirs for ever

Item I Give and bequeath to my son Drury Lundy the Land and
Plantation whereon I now live and all my Lands lying and
being in Sussex on the south side the great swamp I say I give
the same to him and his heirs for ever & Also give to my son
Drury Lundy my Negroes Rachel Abraham and Orange and after
the death or marriage of my beloved Wife I Give my Negroes
except those to my son Drury to him and his heirs for ever

I Also give and bequeath to my son Drury Lundy his choice of
two Horses which are found on the plantation at my Death
together with my Stock of Cattle Sheep except those before bequeathed
Also all my plantation utensils and Household furniture of all
kinds except what is hereafter mentioned I say I give the same
to him and his heirs for ever

Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Harris my
Negroes Senah Cynthia Jerry and Cyndarella to her and her
heirs for ever

Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Christian Reese my
Negroes Daphne Tambi Minny and after the death or
Marriage of my beloved Wife I bequeath to my said Daughter

a Negro called ~~Stute~~ ^{said} to her and her heirs for ever Also I give to my daughter a seal skin Trunk and to her heirs for ever

Item I Give to my Grandson James Stolt a Negro called Richmond to him and his heirs for ever

Item I Give to my Grand daughter Clermont Stolt my Negro called Borcas Also a feather Bed and furniture to her and her heirs for ever

Item I Give to my Grandson Henry Stolt my Negro called Will to him and his heirs for ever

Item I Give to my beloved Wife my Negroes called Rose & Stute during her life or Widowhood and after her decease I Give the Negroe Rose to my Son Drury to him and his heirs forever and my Negroe called Stute I bequeath to my Daughter Christian Rose to her and her heirs for ever

The Residue of my estate both real and personal not before bequeathed I desire may be equally divided among my children by Three Magistrates of the County and I do hereby appoint my Sons Savaia and Drury Executors of this my last Will and Testament revoking all others before by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 24 day of October 1770

is granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form
