and three Leather Chears one armoir D^o and half my Cattle and
sheep one washing tub and all my Cotton and wool and
what is in and my Tenent Saw and one butter pott

Item I Give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Scott five pounds
Cash and one gilt Trunk and what is in it and Cold Still
I Lend unto her During Life and after I give it to my
Granddaughter Elizabeth Scott and one bedstead the best
with a bord and a large pale and piggin and one butter
pott & one bell mettle Skillet

Item I Give unto my Daughter Mary Britlow one feather bed
and one Rug and one blanket and four Sheets and two Pillers

Item I Give unto my Daughter Mary Britlow one feather bed

and bed Head and Cord and mat Standing in the Inward
Room one washing tub and large bowl

that I gave Robt. Ricks that Intended for him out of his pair
and one good Bed and Bedsted mat and Cord two Iron pots
one two hold Nine or ten Gallons and one pair posthooks one
Large Iron spit one small pair Tongs and four Dishes half
Doz. plates one Doz. Spoons two basons two small punch
bowls one Vinegar Cruet and ten bottles one gallon Pitcher
one bottle S. one salt Seller and one small peweeer cup one

large Black Trunk and a diaper Table Cloth half boy Kaphine

divided which is twelve pounds
