Hence I give unto my son Robert Nichols one feather bed and one
rug and one blanket and four sheet and one bed Head mat
and bord two pillars which stands in the inward Room

and three feather sheets one arnd L. and half of my cattle and
sheep one washing tub and all my cotton and wool and
what I. go in and my Tenter fan and one butter pott

Hence I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Scott five pounds
cash and one gilt trunk and what I. go in and Colastile

I lend unto her During life and after I give it to my
granddaughter Elizabeth Scott and one bed Stid the best

with a bord and a large pale and piggin and one butter
pott of one bell mettle Shillet

Hence I give unto my Daughter Mary Britton one feather bed
and one rug and one blanket and four sheets and two pillars

Hem I give unto my Daughter Mary Britton one feather bed
and one rug and one blanket and four sheets and two pillows
and bedstead and cord and mat Standing in the chamber.

Item one washing tub and large bowl

Hem I Give unto my grandson Thomas Ricks Ten pounds
cask and slip flag button Chaires and two Iron pots and
forks and fore head of a young Cattle one Chest with a
Lock and key one Doz. Spoons one gallon pitcher bottle
mug ten Quart bottles

Hem I give to my grandson Robert Ricks four head of a Cattle
that I gave Robt. Ricks that I intended for him out of his part
and one good Bed and Bedsted mat and Cord Two Iron Pots
one two hand Nine or ten gallons and one pair of books one
large broad spit one small pair Tongue and four Dishes half
Doz. Potates one Doz. Spoons two basins two small punch
bowls one Vinegar trist and ten bottles one gallon pitcher
one bottle D. one salt Seller and one small Pewter cup one

she she has in proportion
Item I give the hire of my negroes to my four Children to be equally
divided which is twelve pounds
Item I give unto my son Richard Ricks all of remainder part of my
estate and all the Money that is lent out and he is to pay all my
debts and I do appoint my son Richard Ricks sole Executor to
see this my Last will performed where unto I set my hand and
seal this twenty fifth Day of July one thousand seven hundred
and fifty three
