knowing the uncertainty of this life and that it is appointed
for all mankind to dy do think proper to make and ordain
this my Last Will and Testament in maner and form
following

Item 1 I give and bequeath to my son James Jordan Scott my Negro
Woman called Betty and my Negro Man called Robin
to him and his Heirs forever

Item 2 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Williams
my Riding saddle

Item 3 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Pinner
my large trunk

Item 4 I give and bequeath to my Grandson Jesse Weatherly
one Cow & Calf one Chest one small Dish and one basin
one Dozⁿ of Silver spoons and a small gilt Trunk
but if he dies before he arrive to the age of Twenty one
then to my son James Jordan Scott

Item 5 All the Rest of my Estate of what nature or kind soever
I give and bequeath to my son James Jordan Scott

one Cow & Calf one Chest one Small Dish and one Cason
one Doz. of Pewter ^{Southampton County Wills 1749-1762}

but if he dies before he arrives to the age of Twenty one
then to my son James Jordan Scott

Item 3 All the Rest of my Estate of what nature or kind soever
I give and bequeath to my son James Jordan Scott whom
I make nominate and appoint Executor of this my
Last Will and Testament

And lastly I own this to be my last Will and Testament
revoking and Disannulling all other Wills and Testaments
by me made desegning that this only be taken for my
last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I here
unto set my hand and seal this 9th Day of November 1748
