hundred and seventy one I Frances Demson of Southhampt
Well being being very sick and weak in body yet perfect in
mind and memory these few do thank fits make an
ordain this my last will and testament in form an
manner as followeth

Item I give to my son David one hundred acres of land
Being at the lower end of all my lands next to a pond
called the hunter pond to him his heirs or assigns forever
I give all the remainder part of my lands with the
plantation whereon I lived to my son William to him
his heirs or assigns for ever.

Excepting I give the use of all the Said land and plantation
and Orchardes with all other appurtenances there unto belong-
ing to my wife Elisabeth Denson and my two daughters
namely Sarah and Ann during all which times they shall
live single. I give unto my daughter Sarah one Negro boy
named Click also one negro boy named Sam also my negro
Woman named Amy to her and heirs or assigns for ever
Excepting the first living Child the said Negro woman shall
have after this Date. I give to my Son William to him his
heirs or assigns for ever. I gave to my daughter Ann one negro
Boy named Joynas also one negro girl named Abb to her
