of my Executors hereafter Mentioned as to my worldly goods it hath  
Pleased God to bestow on me I Dispose of them as followeth

Item I give to my Friend Simon Turner of Southampton County a certain  
Parcel of Land Lying in Brunswick County and being part of a Survey of  
Land lately surveyed Between the said Simon Turner and myself  
Beginning at a red oak Standing in Sullavents line on the west side of  
the White oak Gutt then running Down the various Courses of the said  
gutt to Donaldsons line then along Donaldsons Line to the Hermin River  
then up the various Courses of the said River to the said Turners old Line  
Including all the Land in the said Survey that is on the East side of the said  
gutt To him and his Heirs forever

Item I give to my sister Elizabeth Smith three Negroes Toney, Robbin  
and Roger.

Item I give to my Nephew Epam Williamson son of Wm. Williamson  
and Ann his wife all my Lands in Brunswick County purchased  
of James Perham, John Bullivant, William Perry, & Joseph Wright  
Containing about Eight hundred Acres of Land to him the heirs of his body  
Lawfully begotten forever.

Item I give to my sister Anne Williamson forty Pounds Cash

Item I give to my sister Olive Williamson the Plantation whereon I now  
live Containing Two hundred Acres of Land also four hundred and  
forty Acres of Land I purchased of Valentine White by John Johnson  
all and each of the said Tracts of Land to her and her heirs forever

Item I give to my sister Mary Jordan the Use Profits and benefits of  
Two Hundred Acres of Land and a Mill thereon Lying in the  
Tale of Wight County being the Plantation whereon she now  
lives for and During her Natural life Without any Molestation

Interruption or Denial of any Person or Persons that so ever and after
