I George Washington of S^t Hampton County, being
sick and weak of body but of sound of perfect sense and
memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of this
life and that it is appointed for all men to die

do make and ordain this my last will & testament in
 manner and form following to wit.

Then I devise and bequeath unto my son George Washington my
 plantation wherein I now live & all the lands adjacent
 to it beginning at Richard Lanes line a corner tree on
 lightwood stump and from thence a straight line to the
 foot of a small branch where a pear tree is dead & finally
 stood thence down the meadow tract to James Little line
 containing four hundred and forty acres or the same more or less
 I give unto my said son George Washington and the heirs of his
 body lawfully begotten forever.

Then I give devise and bequeath unto my son John Washington
 all the remainder part of my land from lightwood stump to
 his brother Georges line of four hundred or more
 or less acres with the same more or less and the same
 forever I also give him all the property and
 possessed him and heirs forever.

all the remainder, out of which I have left to
his brother George one of four hundred
or less ants bark and the balance of his estate
forever I also gave him all the property
possessed him and wherever I saw
And all the remainder part of my
kind soever after my death I have given
to said George and his heirs unto my son George Washington
his heirs

And lastly I nominate executor and administrator
George and Joseph Washington to receive and collect
all debts due me and to pay me back that day
of September

plantation situate in his love and one hundred fifty
