In the name of god Amen I Robert Carr now being in perfect good sense and memory but calling to mind that all men must die I make this my last will and in manner as followeth Vizt

First I bequeath the my soul to god that gave it in the name of Jesus Christ and my body to be buried in a decent and christianlike manner as for what estate I have ^{at present} I bequeath to ordain me in the following manner

I give and bequeath to my eldest son Robert Carr the plantation situate in this town and two hundred thirty five acres adjoining thereto also one hundred & twenty five acres of land lying in Southampton County on Percy River to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my youngest son John Carr the plantation situate in this town and one hundred & fifty
