her & her heirs forever. I also give unto my wife the use of the plantation wherein
I now live and the use & labour of the following slaves during their natural life
to wit, Peter, Jerry & Daniel and after my wife's decease I give the afore-
said negroes Peter, Jerry & Daniel to my Daughter Mary Bailey & her heirs
forever

I give and bequeath unto my son Joshua Wood one negro fellow named
Jacob to him & his heirs forever

Item

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Bailey my negro boy named
Harvey to her & her heirs forever

Item

I give & bequeath unto my son Moses Wood my negro boy named Dennis
during his natural life and after his decease I give the afore-^d said Dennis
to my Grand son George Wood son of Maria Wood to him & his heirs forever

Item

I further give unto my Wife Wood three cows & calves to him & his heirs forever
I give & bequeath unto my Grand son Richard Bailey one negro boy
named Dick to him & his heirs forever

Item

I give & bequeath unto my Grand son Thomas Wood Son of Mary Wood

Item I give & bequeath unto my Grand Son Richard Bailey one negroe boy named Dick to him & his heirs forever

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Item I give & bequeath unto my Grand son Thomas Wood Son of Benjⁿ Wood Deed one negroe boy named Roger to him & his heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Lucy Bailey one negroe girl named Chloe to her & her heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Mary Wood Daughter of Benjamin Wood Deed thirty pound Cash to her & her heirs forever

My will & desire is that after my just debts & legacies are paid all the remainder of my Estate of what nature or kind soever be equally divided amongst my three Children & two Grand Children (that is Joshua Wood Moore Wood & Mary Bailey & my two Grand Children Thomas Wood & Mary Wood children of Benjⁿ Wood Deed) I further desire & direct that the Land & plantation whereon I now live (after my just debts are paid) be sold for the best price that can be had & the money arising therefrom to be equally divided as above that is to say between my sons and Mary Wood & my daughter Mary Bailey & my two Grand children Thomas & Mary Wood as part of their heirs —

Sadly I am hereby constituted and appointed my son Joshua Wood & my son-in-law Benjamin Bailey Executors of this my last will & Testament I do hereunto set my
