also I give her my negro woman slave named Ruth taken

would bear forever

I give dearest wife begin with unto my daughter Elizabeth two feather beds and furniture one large iron bell four further dishes and plates one chest of drawers and one callister for her world hereafter forever.

All the remainder of my estate of what I have left  
I leave over to my son detailed below my farm  
field in 1795 being 100 acres of land and 1000 ft of  
water front and adjoining to the same containing 1000 ft of  
frontage to the river James running to the south west  
in this my last will and Testament I add nothing  
to all other wills before me leaving this world
