Pot and hooks and one small hot and hooks and Pot Hooks

and one Large Bible and it is my will that my Daughter
Mary Estate shall be paid at the Day of Marriage or when
com of age and if any missing at the time for the Executing
to make it good I give to my beloved wife all the Rest
of my hole Estate Real and Personal all I appoint my wife
and my son John Smith my Executors of this my last will
