 In the name of God amen I Pa. Turner of said Hampton county being
 in health of body but calling to mind the uncertainty of human life
 make & appoint this to be my last will & testament

I Bequeath my soul to Almighty God that gave it hoping to receive a
 joyful resurrection of the same & my body to be buried at the discretion
 of my executors after such legal & due what was truly good & lawful
 Pleased God to bestow on me & mine of them as shall seem

I Give to my son James the lower part of my lands to be divided as follows
 to wit? Beginning at a Barren White oak standing in a Bottom in the
 County line near opposite to his dwelling house then running a straight
 course to a corner white oak & thence on a line at the head of the
 branch including all the lower part of my lands that is below
 the aforesaid division to him & his heirs forever

I Give to my son Jacob the plantation he now lives on together with
 my mill & all my lands of the north side of the Flat Swamp to him &
 his heirs forever I Give to my son Jacob a survey of lands lying
 on the east side of the Flat Swamp in West Hampton county on the same side of
 the Great Branch to him & his heirs forever I Give to my son

Jacob among names James among names Ben among
 girl named Lissy to him & his heirs for ever —

I Give to my daughter Eliz^a my Plantation on Brumbeach
 called Casars & all my lands there adjoining that is on the north
 side of Brumbeach branch to her & her heirs for ever I Give to my
 daughter Elizabeth among names woman named Brou that she
 now in possession together with the increase that she has
 or hereafter shall have to her & her heirs for ever

I Give to my son W^m after his mother's death the plantation
 whereon I now live & all the remainder of my land there unto
 adjoining to him & his heirs for ever I Give to my son W^m my
 plantation of 100 acres of land in Calycary
 swamp in Northampton county whereon Philip Warrad
 live to him & his heirs for ever I Give to my son W^m the following
 my negroes (to wit) Casar & his two children Tom Judah Sarah
 Dick & his Cooper Frank to him & his heirs for ever —

I Give to my son Thomas 50 acres of land in Virginia & I forgive him
 what money he is indebted to me

I Give to my son John those negroes that he has in possession Frank
 Ed & Patience & all their increase that they have had since he

my negro (son) sent him to the store to buy a barrel
 of flour. He said he had a barrel of flour for sale.

Dear Mrs Cooper Frank As soon as this time I ever
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Item. I have sent son Thomas to Court in County of Virginia & for him to pay what money he is indebted to me.

Then I gave to my son John those negroes that he was in possession of with
Cath & Patience Gale their intimates that they have had some be-
haved them in possession or turn after shall have to him & his
 heirs for ever

I leave to my loving wife Anne my Plantation whereon I now
 live also the following negroes Sam Freeman Ck & Solomon
 for during her natural life & after her decease I give the said
 negroes & their increase from this time forward to my son Wm
 & his heirs for ever all the rest of my estate I leave to my loving
 wife Anne during her life & after her decease what is then
 remaining I give to my son Wm & I do appoint my son
 James Jacob & William Davis to this my last will and
 testament hereby revoking all other wills formerly by
 me made & do ordain this to be my last & in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 13 Day
 of July 1763.
