Item It is my will & desire that my loving wife Olive Brown should have & enjoy of all the real & personal estate after my just debts & legacies are paid during her life or widowhood & after her decease on day of marriage I will & I give the said estate both real & personal of what nature or kind soever to my son John Brown & to his heirs forever

Item It is my desire that my executors should not be obliged to give security for the execution of this my will & testament & I shew that my estate should not be affected
