Johnson two shillings and six pence Cash to him and his  
Heirs forever

Item I give devise and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Journeis  
Children the sum of twenty shillings Cash to be equally  
Divided between and to their Heirs forever

Item I give devise and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Howell  
the sum of twenty shillings Cash to her and her Heirs forever

Item I give devise and bequeath to my Dear and loving wife

the sum of twenty shillings Cash to her and her Heirs forever

Item I give devise and Bequeath to my Dear and loving wife  
Mary Dawson the use and profit of my loving plantation  
whereon I now live During her Natural Life with free  
Prevalage of all Timber &c that shall be necessary

for the plantation we also give her the use for life and  
Labors of my Negro Slave called Betty During her Natural  
Life I also give her One full half of all my Personal Estate  
to her of her choice forever To determine my will of Desire  
that the other half of my Personal Estate with a certain  
Tract or Parcel of Land lying on the North side of Black  
Creek Swamp containing forty five acres more or less  
shall be sold to the best advantage by my Executor  
named and the Money arising therefrom to be applied to  
wounds Paying my Debts Legacies of funeral Expenditure  
from I give Desire and Bequeath to my Grand son Denise  
Dawson after my Wife Mary's Death the plantation  
and Negro Slave Betty also the following slaves to wit  
Peter, Sarah, and Rozella also all other the lands and  
Processions of what nature or kind ever that I have  
any right Title or Interest in Excepting what I have
