whereof it has pleased almighty god to strip me of

year of my life to be disposed by my executors and at my death
and at my marriage a negro boy called Will to him and his heirs
forever

I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas L. Williams his first year
from time of my death continuing three hundred and ten dollars per
annum or less otherwise to provide for him during the term of his life called here
after the age of twenty one years and one bed and furniture and
the fifth year of my life to him and his heirs. All rights being called
back at my wife's decease or removal.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Edna Ann West my
cabinet dining set the age of 210 years to be sold by my executors one
negro boy called Will at my wife's death the same day and the
fifth year of my life to her one bed and furniture.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Edna at my wife's death
at her marriage James L. Williams and Ross at the age of twenty five
bed and furniture and the fifth year of my life to her and her heirs
at my wife's death to be sold and the money

among from five said sales may especially be directed towards my
four children I am now leaving to my wife, I want her to have the
consider part of this estate after my just debts are paid
I give and bequeath unto my wife all said lands and so forth
described by it be of either nature of quantity except and if
so likewise constitute and contain my former will that
William and Mary Clements my wife having
lived about 10 years after my death and still
will have full power and free disposal
and demand all and every other former testaments with legacies
and bequests and accousets by me in any wise before made
and bequeath and command you and
my wife to be my last will and testament as before set forth
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and year first
January A.D.

the house or lot of land before it number 1000 and I
give him complete and clear my former Father's will

which bequeath and bequeath by me in any wise before made
and recited bequeath certifying and affirming this and
no other to be my last will and testament in writing and first
I have caused to be my Seal and seal this day and year first
page written.
