Item I give the use of my negro fellow Jimmy to my daughter Hannah Davis during
her life and at her death I give the said negro Jimmy to my grandson Phillip Davis
and his heirs forever

Item I give unto my son John Phillips all my land lying on the east side of the Brasey
Pond branch to him and his heirs forever also my Bed and furniture upon his giving his
daughter Lucy when she arrives to the age of eighteen years of marriage the sum of
nine pounds current money of Virginia

I give the use of my negro girl Charlot to my grandson Edwin Ellis till my grand John
Phillips arrives to the age of twenty one years then to him and his heirs forever

I constitute and appoint my Son Joseph Phillips my whole & sole executor of this
my last will and testament In witness I have hereunto set my hand and Seal
this 18th day of January 1779
