Item I give devise and bequeath to my son John Scarbrough after his Mother decease the
plantation and whereon I now live to him and to his heirs and assigns forever

Item My will and desire is that all the sum or sums of my estate real and personal after the death
of my wife may be equally divided between my five ^{youngest} children Wm^r John Lucy Patty a Becky
and Sarah Scarbrough and to their heirs & assigns

Item I do hereby revoke and appoint my dear & loving wife Mary Scarbrough to be my
whole & sole executrix to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all disavowing
all other wills or wills by me heretofore made or made
