the general resurrection of men to be decently buried at the de-
cotion of my executors herein after named and to my real and
personal estate I give proposito of it in accordance hereto leaving of
him of whom I speak and his son Thomas son of Richard Thompson
all that plantation containing one hundred acres wherein Arthur
Sellers formerly dwelt also all my land of plantations wherein now
dwells and all the stock of horses cattle hogs sheep thereunto belonging
and for cause of the Indians living thereon the
last and of the year thousand seven hundred and
good life he has lived to him of his heirs for ever and his following
proxies & Successors & in witness whereof I have signed this my last will and Testament.

bequeath my said estate that gave it solely trusting through it by
mediation of my wife Elizabeth to her son Thomas to receive at
the general distribution of the same to be decently buried at the execu-

I will also I give him one feather bed of furniture of four
leather bottoms chairs to be delivered to him at the age of
one dozen Years

Mem I give and bequeath unto James Naigaran son of Henry
Naigaran one negro girl called Castle to be delivered to him as
soon to be delivered to him or his son as he arrives to the

I give and bequeath unto James Vaughan son of Henry Vaughan one negro girl called Easter to her if his heirs do not take delivery to him or her at the age of twenty one years

I give and bequeath unto James Vaughan son of Henry Vaughan one negro girl called Easter to her if his heirs do not take delivery to him or her at the age of twenty one years

I give and bequeath unto Henry Vaughan son of Henry Vaughan one negro girl named Lucy to him and his heirs for ever to be held in trust from thereof as soon as he arrives to full age of twenty one years

I give and bequeath unto Mary Vaughan daughter of Henry Vaughan one negro girl named Sarah to her if his heirs for ever to be delivered to her at the age of not less than fifteen years on day of marriage which of them shall first happen

I give and bequeath to Thomas Vaughan son of said Henry Vaughan part of the lands purchased of the Indians of the plantation thereunto belonging lying by being on the South side of the Grand River

to be put in possession thereof as soon as he arrives with the

age of twenty one years

I give and bequeath unto Mary D. Dugyan MacCoyhan daughter

of his son Henry Dugyan one my negroe girl named Sarah

to her of her heirs forever to be delivered to her at the age of six

from thence on day of marriage which of them shall first happen

I give and bequeath to Thomas Vaughan son of said Henry Dugyan

part of the land purchased of the Indians with plantation

thereunto belonging lying lying on the North side of the Great Branch

bordered by the said branch of Dugyan or Dugane line of the head

and to him of her heirs forever to be delivered to him at the age

of twenty one years

I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Amman the use of all my

plantation with the land & houses & following negroes ^{for her}

Harriet James & Tom during her life & also those of all my

stock of cattle hogs & sheep also all my horses & goods furniture

to her as she shall think proper for the maintenance of herself

I hereby disown her left hand after her decease I give & bequeath
 the same to John Thomas & Blas son of John & Blas son of John &
 also of my next and dearest that of such in any of the said
 Blas as have in my mind when I die without being lawfully
 together that then the last will be made to him or to them granted
 shall fall to the next heirs but if they should all die without
 issue as aforesaid that then the whole estate to them herein
 granted shall fall & descend to James Vaughan son of Henry
 Vaughan and his heirs for ever.

Item I make and ordain John Thomas & Blas & Elizabeth Inman my
 sole executors & trustees of this my last will & testament
 but in case of the death of the said Elizabeth Inman I do
 appoint Henry Vaughan trustee to see this my will performed
 in witness whereof I have signed to set my hand & seal therof
 day of April 1763

signed him for a sum of four shillings in due form
