and Chattles as I have already possessed him with to him and his heirs forever

Item I give unto my Son Charles Wellons all the plantation and land as Now live on
and all the said land and plantation as he now lives on containing by estimation
two hundred Acres which be all the residue and remainder of my land of his
another my wife Anne Wellons and for enduring his life Mary Ingle life
and she the said Mary shall have liberty to chose any part of this said land
and plantation to live on and to cultivate as long as she the said Mary doth
live single and after the death of her the said Mary doth

Mary doth firmly give this said land and plantation to my said Son Charles

Will ing more or less two hundred and fifty Acres to him and his heirs forever and the goods and Chattles as have already possessed him to him and his heirs forever

And I give and bequeath unto my Son Henry Wellons the plantation whereon he now lives and the lands as I have already marked off to the plantation containing by estimation two hundred Acres more or less to him and his heirs forever. And all the goods and Chattles, as I have already possessed him with to him and his heirs forever

And I give unto my Son Charles Wellons all the plantation and land as now lies on and all the said land and plantation as he now lives on containing by estimation or two hundred Acres which be all the residue and remainder of my land of his mother my wife Anne Wellons and for enduring his life

and she the said Mary shall have liberty to chose any part of this said land and plantation to live on and to cultivate as long as she the said Mary doth live single and after the death of her

Mary I doth firmly give this said land and plantation to my said Son Charles Wellons before mentioned and all the goods & Chattles as have already possessed him with to him and his heirs forever

And I give unto my Daughter Mary Wellons two Chests and two feather beds and furniture & two Cows & Calves to her and her heirs forever and I also give unto the said Mary my Negro Girl as I now have named Kate after

after the death of my wife Annemoriah Wellons to she the said Mary and her heirs forever. and my weaving Loom and all the gear thereunto belonging to she and her heirs forever

Item I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Branch the wife of Howel Branch all that

I have already possessed her with to she and her heirs forever

Item I give unto my daughter Barbary Oney the wife of Benjamin Oney all that I have already possessed her with to she and her heirs forever

I lend unto my loving wife Annemoriah Wellons the use of my lands and my two Negroes Peter and Kate and all the residue & remainder of my estate of whatsoever it will after my just debts being paid for Enduring her natural life and after her decease to be equally divided peaceable and quietly between all my Children or them or their heirs & assigns to be to them and theirs forever

I do also appoint my two sons John Wellons and Charles Wellons Executors of this my last will and testament as in witness whereof I doth hereunto set my hand and affix my Seal this the 18th Day of December 1773
