shall not be left to attain to the age of twenty-one years, then
I give the said land to my son Nat'l & his heirs forever

Item I give the remaining & other parts of my land whenever I
see fit to be equitably divided when my son Nat'l comes to the
age of twenty-one years between myself & William Nelson
to him and his heirs forever

Item I give to my son Moses one hundred & fifty acres of land, more
or less that I thought of, & so long as he & his heirs forever
give to my son Moses ^{ten Pounds} current money to be raised out of my
estate

Item I give to my son James one Negro man called Little Peter

Item I give to my son Elizur one Negro man named Jack to have
of his slaves forever, I give unto my son Thomas all my
domestic slaves to have & to keep & to use forever

Item I give to my son Russell my Negro girl Doll to have & to
use forever — Item I leave to my loving wife Maria

The rest of Negro man called Israel Peters for 8 daughters
natural & of his own blood & after her marriage or otherwise

to be sold to the highest bidder & the money therefrom
according to be equally divided among all my children
that shall then living

Item I leave all the remainder of my estate after my test
duty & expenses & legacies are paid to be apportioned
to remain in my poor hands to bring up my
children till at least they shall attain to the age of
twenty one year and as fast as they shall come to the

 in an equal proportion according to the value of the
 property belonging to my wife and children, that
 out of the same and due upon my living wife
 the sum of my living brother James Parry's share
 of his last will & Testament hereby revoking
