it lyeth or may be found -

Item I give & bequeath to my Son Abraham Wiggins my Tract
of Land whereon I now live to him the said Abraham
& to his heirs forever I also give my said Son Abraham
one third of my ^{Personal} Estate

Item I do constitute & appoint my two aforesaid Sons
Richard Wiggins & Abraham Wiggins my whole & sole
Executors of this my last will & Testament in and to
