Executors hereafter named

After my just debts are paid I give and bequath one half of my
estate to my well beloved Wife Elizabeth and to her heirs and assigns
The other half of my estate I give and bequath to the Child which
my Wife now goeth with (if any) but if my Wife should not be with
child or the child should be born dead It is my Will and desire
that my Wife should have all my estate to her and her heirs and
assigns for ever

I do hereby nominate and appoint my Dear friend John Beale
my whole and sole Executor to this my last will and testament hereby
revoking all other Wills legacies and bequeaths by me heretofore
made of what nature or kind soever hereby Ratifying and confirm-
ing this as my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I

that my Wife should have during her life
a thirds for ever

lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my Dear friend John Beale
my whole and sole Executor to this my last will and testament hereby
revoking all other Wills legacies and bequeaths by me heretofore
made of what nature or kind soever hereby Ratifying and confirming
this as my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this 13th day of January
