will & testament in manner & form following To wit,

I Give devise & bequeath unto my dear loving wife Mary the use and profit of
my plantation whereon I now live together with the use profit & labour of my
negro man slave named ~~Sam~~ ^{Sam} for assuring the term of her years
the the use profit & labour of the following slaves to wit Joan Peg with all
the other accords of my estate of what nature or kind so ever except the legacies
which I hereafter bequeath & for giving the term of her natural life & then the
above mentioned negroes Sam Peg & their ^{for what other estate may}
be remaining to be equally divided between my Executors as purchase
John Nathas Ponce Britain & Thidith

I Give devise & bequeath unto my son John Jaynes the plantation & land

wherein there is one hundred and fifty five acres of land
negro boy slave name Whingo to him for his life for ever

Item I Give devise and bequeath unto my son Nathan Poyner the plantation
of land wherein he now lives containing one hundred and fifty five acres more or less
also a negro girl slave name Hannah to him for his life for ever
I Give devise and bequeath unto my son Anna Poyner the plantation
of land wherein he now lives containing one hundred and fifty five acres more or less
also one negro boy slave name Tommy to him for his life for ever

Item I Give devise and bequeath unto my son Britain Poyner the plantation and
land wherein he now lives containing one hundred and fifty five acres more or less only
reserving his mother's life therein also I give to him one negro girl slave
name Rose for an negro man slave name Tony only reserving to his
mother the use of the said land till the day of her marriage or
death also one feather bed and furniture and household goods
year old horses four goats to him and his heirs for ever

Item I Give devise and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Williams the sum
of five shillings current money to her for her life

Item I Give devise and bequeath unto my grandson Walter Williams my
negro man slave name Will to him and his heirs for ever

Item I Give devise and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Poyner the sum

of five shillings current money to her & her heirs
 Item I Give eleven and a half pounds to my daughter Sarah Lacy an
 negro boy slave named Robin and leather bed & furniture & one con
 pable to her & her heirs

And Lastly I nominate & appoint my son John Lacy of my friends
 Job Wright to be my executor to this my last will & Testament as
 Witness my hand & seal this sixth day of Aug. 1767
