Item I give unto my loving wife Ann Hallman my my
man slave named Sam to her and her heirs I give my
said wife the plantation where I now live and all the
lands I am possessed off and after my wifes death my
will is that my executors sell the said plantation of land
for the most that can be got for it of the money arising
on the sale to be equally divided between my four
daughters Mary Lucy Sarah and Martha and in case any
of my daughters die before such division her equal part
to be ^{equally} divided between her children I give my daughter
Lucy Andrews one negro boy named Sam to her and
her heirs forever.

Item I give my daughter Mary Clayton one negro boy
named Jacob to her and her heirs

Item I give my daughter Sarah Moody one negro girl named
Beck to her and her heirs

of my daughters die before suit division her equal part
to be ^{equally} divided between her children. I give my daughter
Lucy Andrews one negro boy named Tom to her and
her heirs forever.

Item I give my daughter Mary Clapton one negro boy
named Jacob to her and her heirs

Item I give my daughter Sarah Moody one negro girl named
Beck to her and her heirs

Item I give my daughter Martha Krough one negro girl named
Aga to her and her heirs

Item I give my said wife the use of the following negroes
that is to say Pese, Phillis & Charles & Will and also what personal
estate I am possessed of during her natural life and after
her death my will is that if my daughters cannot agree between
themselves upon a division then my executors to sell my estate
to the highest bidder and the money be equally divided
between my said daughters and in case one or more of my
said daughters die before my wife then her or their parts
to be equally divided between their surviving children

and do make this my last will and testament revoking all
 other wills heretofore made by me and do appoint my friend
 Thomas Williamson and my son in law John Clayton my
 whole and sole executors of this my last will and
 testament given under my hand this 3^d day of October 1763
