At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 13 day of February 1772
There was presented in Court by John Thorpe three executors therein named
proved by the oaths of Clay Johnson and Hardy Harris two of the witnesses
therein and ordered to be recorded And on the motion of the executor of the
said estate who made oath according to Law Courtbook is granted his right
obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security as usual

In the name of God Amen I Lazarus Johnson of Southampton
County in Virginia being sick and weak of body but of sound and disposing
mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of this body
and that is appointed for all men to die I have made this my last Will and testament
and constitute and ordain this my last Will and testament
as follows and have subscribed following

Item

I give devise and bequeath unto my dear and long loved daughter Sarah my beloved Puddle and Sadell Child of Puddle with all my Stock of Sheep and hogs one feather bed and furniture one iron pot one iron trivet one Dish one Spoon 4 plates 8 Sa. spoons one hand Mill one Churn one press 2 Deer heads two load bars & one Ox all my reading books one Wading school & Cards one Smoothing iron & one saw one and all the iron one Table saw hides one 1/2 Hides 3 yds Red 6 Glass bottles with all the rest that is in the house to her and her & her Descendants with the Leather &c.

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my son David Johnson the plantation ^{in land} where now land containing 100 acres also given him 50 acres more adjoining to John Puddle land to him and his heirs forever. Also one Gun one pewee dish one iron 3 plates one feather bed and furniture one green stone one green horn one iron one hand saw one sword & Bagonet

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Johnson one feather bed and furniture one Churn one pewee dish one Spoon three plates & one iron pot to her & hers

Item I give & devise unto my daughter Martha Johnson one feather bed and furniture one pewee dish one Spoon three plates six spoons and one iron pot

upon full to her ^{the} heirs

Item

I give & devise unto my daughter Martha Johnson one feather bed and
furniture one pewter dish one Barrow three plates six spoons and one iron pot
to her and her heirs. All the remainder part of my estate after my just
debts are paid I give to be equally divided between my three children
as above named.

And lastly I constitute
Wright to be executor of this my last will and testament as Witness
herein this 28 day of December 1774
