Item I Give to Rob^t. Carr one Shilling & a half.

Item I Give to my granddaughter Martha Reel twenty Shillings Current Money & to her heirs forever.

Item I Give to my Grandson Andrew Griffins Son of Pheneas Griffins my Mulatto boy named Dick and to his heirs forever he payin half the Charge of proving my Will.
