Not being doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by
the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath
pleased God to bless me in this life I give demise and dispose of the same in the
following manner and form)

Item, I give and bequeath unto James Right the son of Joseph Right
one bed and furniture and one pewter dish and four pewter plates two basins
one dozen spoons two earthen plates one Churn one small bucket and one gallon Jug and
five bottles and one leaden pail and one Cyprus Egg and one brass candle stand
and brass pepper box and one glass salt cellar and one four gallon pot and one Shovel
Item I give and bequeath unto John Right the Son of Joseph Right One bed and furniture
and two gallon pot and one basin and one dish and two plates of iron earthen plate
Item I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Right all the remainder of my Estate
And I do appoint my son Joseph Right and John Dunde my wholly and sole Executors
to this my last Will and Testament, I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my

to be buried in decent manner or Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors
Nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by
the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate whereunto it hath
pleased God to bestow me in this life I give demise it and dispose of the same in the
following manner and form.

Item I give and bequeath unto James Right the son of Joseph Right
one bed and furniture and one pewee dish and four pewee plates two basins
one dozen spoons two earthen plates one Chertons small trunk and one gallon Jug and
two bottles and one beaded plate and one Cyprus Pegg and one brass candle stick
and one pewee cup and one glass eight cellars and one four gallon pot and one Shillet
Item I give and bequeath unto John Right the Son of Joseph Right One bed and furniture
and one gallon pot and one basin and one dish and two plates and one earthen plate

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Joseph Right all the remainder of my estate
And I do appoint my Son Joseph Right and John Dunsell my wholly and sole Executors
to this my last Will and Testament, I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my
seal the 28th day of Dec: 1780.

In the presence of West-Tinors Matthew Smith Mary his Right Hand

At Court held for the County of Southampton the 13th Sep: 1781. This Will was presented in
Court by Joseph Right the Executor thereof and proved by oaths of West-Tinors one of the Witnesses
thereunto and ordered to be Recorded. And on the Motion of the Executor who made oath according
to the Statute in that behalf made he gave Receipt for the same to
James Kello Co.
