Then I give and bequeath to my daughter Anne for further behoof
 one negro girl Jerry and her heirs with the thirty pounds
 worth to her then living forever

Then I give and desire is that if my daughter Anne dies
 under age or without issue that all the lands & tenements
 herebefore going to my daughter Anne should be given to my
 god son William Stephenson and his heirs forever

Then I bequeath all the rest of my estate of what nature
 soever to my wife Sarah and after her death to my
 daughter Anne and her heirs forever
