In the name of God Amen. I Richard Jones of Southampton County Virginia
being of sound sound and disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will
and Testament in manner following (to wit) after my just debts and Funeral expences are
defrayed I dispose of my property as followeth.

Imprimis) I give and bequeath to my beloved wife all that Tract or parcel of Land whereon I now
live containing by estimation two hundred and eighty eight Acres be the same more or less
during her natural life. I also give to my said wife all my stock of Horses, Cattle, Sheep
and Hogs; also my Household Furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give unto Willis Jagers son of Amos Jagers and his heirs forever all that Tract of Land
whereon I now live containing by estimation Two hundred and eighty eight Acres be same
more or less, after my wife's death.

Item I do constitute and appoint my Friend Jacob Burns whole and sole and sole executor of
this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Seal this 27th day of September 1781.
