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at a court held for the county of Southampton the 10th day
of October 1765.

This account current of the estate of John Scott
decd was reported by the persons appointed to settle the
same and ordered to be recorded.

In the name of god amen I Richard Phipps of the parish of Saint Luke
and county of Southampton being of sound & disposing mind & memory
do make this my last will and testament in manner following
after recommending my soul to god the creator of it and all things
and my body to decently buried at the discretion of my
executors hereafter mentioned

First I give and devise all my just debts to first pay
them I lend to my loving wife during her natural life my best
feather bed and furniture one spinning one comb one boy one
one iron pot which has one year broke and the one half of my
pecunia & I give and bequeath to my said wife all the

stock of hogs that I now own with five barrels of corn which
said stock of hogs and corn I give and bequeath to him and his
heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my loving son Burwell these one feather
bed and furniture one chest and iron pot from which one fixing
pan and the one half of my winter which said feather bed of
furniture chest iron pot charcoal firing pan & winter I give
and bequeath to my said son and to his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary these after the death of
my wife the bed and furniture spanning what loom bog iron iron
pot and the one half of my winter which I lent to my said wife
which said bed what loom bog iron iron pot & winter I give of
bequeath to my said daughter and to her heirs forever

My will and desire is that all the remainder of my estate of
what nature or kind soever or whatsoever found be sold & after
my just debts being paid out of it the remainder to be equally
divided between my son Burwell these and my daughter Mary
these to him and his heirs forever and I appoint my son
Burwell these and Amos Harris executor hereby in witness all

other wills by me heretofore made and declare this to be my
only last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal this fifth day of July 1768
I signed published & declared

by the testator as his last will &
testament & by his direction for his
purpose signed and witnessed

And be it further ordered for the cause of the petitioners that on the 10th day of October 1768
this will was presented in court by the executors therein named
proved by the oath of William Sney a witness thereto and ordered
to be recorded. And on the Motion of James Jones the executors
refusing to qualify / who made oath answering to leave
certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the
estate of the deceased Richard Rose with this will annexed
giving security &c.
