what Imperial Estate it hath been pleased god to bestow on me
dispose in manner & Term following viz

I Give & bequeath to my son Charles one negro man called George to him
& his heirs forever

I Give to my son Robert one negro girl called Ann & all her Increase
to him & his heirs forever

I Give to my son John one negro girl called Sarah & all her Increase
to him & his heirs forever

I Give to my Daughter Martha one negro Boy called Dick to her
& her heirs forever

I Give to my son Thomas one negro girl called Lucy & all her Increase
to him & his heirs forever

I Give to my son Benjamin one negro Boy called Dick to him and
his heirs forever

I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth one negro Girl called Amy full
her Increase to her & her Heirs forever

I Give to my Daughter Mary one negro Boy called Sampson to
her & her Heirs forever

I Give to my Daughter Sarah one negro Girl called Abigail full Her
Increase to her & her Heirs forever

My Will & desire is that my five sons & four Daughters may Inve-
stee what they have already of my Estate in possession & administration
& appoint my son Charles & my Daughter Elizabeth Executors of
this my Last Will & Testament For Witnesses whereof I have hereunto
set my Hand & Seal this 13th day of January 1748
