Robert In the Name of God Amen

Mourner's
Will

I Robert Mourner of Nottoway Parish in the County of
Isle of Wight being sick and weak in body but of perfect sound
mind and memory thank be therefore given to almighty God
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I do
make constitute and appoint this my last will and testament
revoking all other wills heretofore made by me

Imp^o my soul I resign to God that gave it hoping for pardon and
remission of all my sins through the merits and mediation
of Jesus Christ

Item my body I resign to the Earth from whence it was taken to be
decently buried by my Executors hereafter named

Item I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Mourner the plantation
whereon he now lives and all the lands belonging to it being

99 one hundred acres more or less and to his heirs forever
Item I give to my daughter Amy Pittman the plantation whereon
she now lives and one hundred acres of land belonging to the
same and to the heirs of her body lawfully begotten for ever y^e ma-
low and one feather bed

Item I give to my Grandson Henry Mounger the plantation whereon
I now live and all the Land belonging to it being two hundred
acres more or less and to his heirs forever

Item it is my will that my wife should have the use of all the rest of
my Estate after my just debt & Legacies paid during her life
or widowhood and after her Decease to be Equally Divided between
my son Joseph and my Daughter Amy share & share alike.

Item I do appoint my son Joseph and Samson Pittman Sole Exors
of this my Last will and testament In Witness whereof I
hereunto set my hand and Seal this 10th Day of September 1752

A court held for the County of Southampton on Thuro day
the 9th Day of November 1752.

This will was presented in court by Joseph Mounger & Lampson
pitman the Executors therein named proved by Joseph Jones &
Benjamin Joyner two of the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be
Recorded and on the Motion of the said Executors who made
Oath according to Law Certificate was granted them for obtaining
a probat thereof in due form giving Security
