seventy eight I Samuel Newsum of the County of New Hampton Being very sick and Weak
in Body but of a perfect mind and Memory and Calling to mind the mortality of my Body
and Knowing that it is appointed for all Men Once to Die to make and Ordain this my
Last Will and Testament that I do say First I give and Recommend my Soul into the
hands of a Heavenly God and my Body I Recommend to the Earth to be Buried in the
usual Christian Buriall not Doubting but I shall Receive the same again by the Grace
of Almighty God that gave it and as Touching my worldly Estate which God of his great
Mercy hath bestowed on me in this Life I Give Devise and Dispose of the same
in the following Manner and Form. I Give and Bequeath to my loving Wife

Mary Newsum One Feather bed and Furniture my Grace and Tide Saddle one Great box
Chest and a new Linen Chest and Eggs One Howard Foundry Pot and all my Crop of
Corn and not hereafter Disposed of all which I give to her and her Heirs forever
I Give to my loving Wife Mary Newsum the Use of my Land and Plantation Lye
this beithing Will and Commission also all my Household and Kitchen Furniture of
What kind or Quality I have during her Natural life, Item I Give to my son
Hartwell Newsum of the Decease of my Wife my Land and Plantation Whose name shall
be with all appurtenances hereunto belonging after my Water Crop Mill with one
Acre of Land on each side the said Mill together with the Stone Iron work and all
Appurtenances thereunto belonging all which I give to him and his Heirs forever
I Give to my loving Wife Mary Newsum One her Natural life the Use of the
Appurtenances of my House, Jane, Sarah, Felt, Peter, and Bob, and after her Decease
I Give to my Son Hartwell Newsum, Jane, Sarah, Coll, Peter, and Bob to be equally divided

 this eighth Day of September one Thousand Seven hundred Seventy Eight
